IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- Health Department clinics on Thursdays are 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. with extended hours from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on September 24, 2009, and October 8, 2009.
- Seasonal flu vaccine for adults 19 years of age and older will be administered at the Health Department on a walk-in basis on Thursdays starting September 17, 2009.
- Pediatric seasonal flu vaccine for children six (6) months through 18 years of age will be administered at the Health Department on a walk-in basis beginning Thursday, September 24, 2009. A parent or legal guardian must accompany individuals under the age of 18.
- Seasonal flu vaccine at Resource Bank and Fox Valley Older Adult Center is for adults 19 years of age and older only.
- There is a \$37.00 charge for the seasonal flu vaccine. We accept all major credit cards with photo identification at on-site clinics held at the Health Department only. Medicare or Medicaid will be billed. You must bring your Medicare or Medicaid card with you along with photo identification.
- Income-eligible children can receive their pediatric seasonal flu vaccine through the Vaccines for Children Program at a substantial cost savings. Vaccine for this State-funded program will only be available on-site at the Health Department.
- Seasonal flu vaccine will not be given to individuals allergic to eggs or report a history of previous adverse reactions after receiving the seasonal flu vaccine.
- The seasonal flu vaccine is not expected to provide protection against novel H1N1 influenza (swine flu). However, H1N1 (swine) flu vaccine is currently in production and is expected to be available mid-October at the soonest for target groups.
