ORDINANCE 2016-05

**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A ZONING MAP AMENDMENT
FOR 9970 KESLINGER ROAD
IN AFTON TOWNSHIP**

WHEREAS, CA Property Management, acting on behalf of the property owner, Perry C. and Thelma M. Read Trust, has filed a petition for a Zoning Map Amendment to change the zoning of property located at 9970 Keslinger Road from PD-C, Planned Development-Commercial to PD-I, Planned Development - Industrial, said property being located in unincorporated Afton Township and legally described as shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and said application having been submitted in accordance with the requirements of Article 10 of the DeKalb County Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, following due and proper notice by publication in the Daily Chronicle not less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days prior thereto, and by mailing notice to all owners of property abutting the subject property at least ten (10) days prior thereto, the DeKalb County Hearing Officer conducted a public hearing on May 12, 2016 at which the petitioner presented evidence, testimony, and exhibits in support of the requested Zoning Map Amendment, and no members of the public spoke in favor of the request and none in opposition thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Hearing Officer has considered the evidence, testimony and exhibits presented at the public hearing and has made findings of fact and recommended that the Zoning Map Amendment be approved, as set forth in the Findings of Fact and Recommendation of the DeKalb County Hearing Officer, dated May 12, 2016, a copy of which is appended hereto as Exhibit "B"; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Committee of the DeKalb County Board has considered the evidence and testimony from the public hearing and the findings of fact and recommendation of the Hearing Officer, and has forwarded to the DeKalb County Board a motion to approve the requested Zoning Map Amendment; and

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Board has considered the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Committee and the report and findings of fact of the Hearing Officer, and has determined that the requested Zoning Map Amendment to change the zoning of the subject property from PD-C, Planned Development - Commercial District to PD-I, Planned Development - Industrial District, would be consistent with the findings required by Section 10.04.F of the DeKalb County Zoning Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF DEKALB COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION ONE: The report and findings of fact and recommendation of the DeKalb County Hearing Officer, Exhibit "B" attached hereto, are hereby adopted as the findings of fact and conclusions of the DeKalb County Board.

SECTION TWO: Based on the findings of fact adopted herein, the property located 9970 Keslinger Road in unincorporated Afton Township and legally described as shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, is hereby rezoned from PD-C, Planned Development - Commercial District to PD-I, Planned Development - Industrial District, and the DeKalb County Zoning Map shall be Amended to reflect said zone change.

SECTION THREE: The subject property may be used for a commercial pumping business as set forth in the application for Zoning Map Amendment submitted by CA Property Management, referenced herein as though attached hereto. Further, the subject property may be used for those uses permitted in the MC, Manufacturing Conservation District provided, however, that any change in use shall be subject to review and approval by the Planning and Zoning Committee of the DeKalb County Board.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption by the County Board of DeKalb County, Illinois.



Legal Description of the Subject Property

FINDINGS OF FACT

This matter comes before the DeKalb County Zoning Hearing Officer on May 12, 2016 for petition requesting rezoning. CA Property Management, Inc., acting on behalf of the property owner, Perry C. & Thelma M. Read Trust, has filed a petition for a zoning map amendment to change the zoning of property located at 9970 Keslinger Road, from PD-C, Planned Development-Commercial to PD-I, Planned Development-Industrial. The requested map amendment is to accommodate use of the property by a commercial pumping service.

The application of the Petitioner was duly filed in accord with the DeKalb County Code. The Petition and its attachments are incorporated into the record of proceedings herein by reference.

Publication of Notice

The notice of public hearing has been duly published in accord with the DeKalb County Code. A certificate of publication has been received into the record and reflects publication in the Daily Chronicle on April 23-24, 2016. Correspondence has been sent to all adjacent property owners.

Location of Subject Property

The subject property is located at 9970 Keslinger Road, DeKalb, Illinois, which is the southwest corner of the intersection of Keslinger Road and State Route 23.

Site Characteristics

A. Location – Access

The subject parcel totals 4.45 acres and is presently zoned PD-C, Planned Development-Commercial. The property has been vacant for a number of years, however, originally was the location of a tire store and before that a farm equipment company. The land to the north is zoned Agricultural A-1, to the south zoned Business PD-C and the land to the east and west are also zoned Agricultural A-1. The property is located less than one mile from the city limits of

DeKalb. A Unified Future Land Use Plan of the DeKalb County Unified Comprehensive Plan recommends Agricultural uses on the subject property.

B. Proposed Use

Plans call for the property to be used for storage of vehicles used in the Petitioner's business, a place to maintain its vehicles, and a place to perform dispatch work to carry out his business operations, such as accounting, bookkeeping, human resources and payroll.

Persons appearing on behalf of the Petitioner

The Petitioner's attorney, Mr. Charles Cronauer, of 1101 DeKalb Avenue, Sycamore, Illinois appeared representing Mr. Christopher Hartness, the president of the company. Mrs. Christopher Hartness was also present and both of them testified. Mr. Cronauer stated that they desire to have the property zoned PD-Manufacturing allowing all uses and special uses permitted in MC-Manufacturing Conservation District and all uses and special uses permitted in BC-Business Conservation District. After some discussion, they agreed that this would probably be a little too broad to be granted at this time. They stated that the property is basically an eyesore now and they want to use it to provide services not unlike the way the property has been used in the past. They stated that they have eight people employed in their business and that three or four of them would be on the property every day. They do not propose any changes with regards to the landscaping or parking. They do not propose to do any grading, and they do not desire a sign. They are requesting a waiver regarding the site development requirements. They stated that there would be very little traffic on the property. Presently their business owns three large trucks that are used to transfer material that is pumped from blocked sewer and drain lines and also from pumping services provided for septic, grease traps and other similar pumping activities. These services require that the company pump the substances from a customer location in to one of their trucks, transport the substances to a disposal site, such as Wheaton Sanitary District, DeKalb Sanitary District, Downers Grove Sanitary District or DuPage County Department of Public Works. They stated that none of these products are stored on the property at any time, except sometimes if they have been unable to unload their trucks on any given day, it may sit on the property overnight with some of the material in the truck. The trucks are sealed and no odor is allowed to escape from the vehicle.

They basically have new equipment and have been in business approximately ten years and have never had a problem in this regard. All vehicles will be kept inside when on the property.

They further testified that there is a well and septic on the property. They have had the well inspected and it is in proper working condition.

Correspondence was received from the DeKalb County Public Health Department indicating they had no issues with the change. An email note was received from Bruce and Kenna Anderson asking if any waste storage would take place on the site. They stated they had

concerns about soil contamination as well as odor from the waste. A staff report was received into the record from Paul R. Miller


No one appeared to object to the Petition.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND RECOMMENDATION

The undersigned finds that Petitioner's proposed use of the property is not inconsistent with the prior uses of the property and it does not appear this use of the property would adversely affect the value of the properties in the surrounding area. There is no evidence that there would be an odor or contamination on the property as a result of the proposed use. There would be very limited traffic and from the property. It appears that this property is suitable for the use permitted under the existing zoning classification and in view of the fact that there is an existing building there and no additions are planned, no fencing is planned and no sign is planned, it does not appear that there would be an adverse effect from the proposed change upon the public health, safety and welfare of the community.

Accordingly, the undersigned recommends that the property be rezoned to Planned Development-Industrial to be used for the pumping business as set forth above and further that any of the permitted uses to the MC Manufacturing District be permitted provided, however, that any change in use shall be subject to review and approval of the DeKalb County Planning and Zoning Committee.

Ordinance 2016 – 06

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 7 of the County Code

WHEREAS, the County has had the ability and authority to license the conduct of “raffles” and has recently been given the authority by the State to now include “poker runs” as defined in the Illinois Raffles and Poker Run Act, 230 ILCA 15, and recognizes that the conduct of raffles and poker runs without a license may be a criminal act pursuant to 720 ILCS 65/28-1; and,

WHEREAS, the County recognizes that properly conducted raffles and poker runs can be an important source of fundraising to support local not for profits and charitable organizations, and thus supports the continuing availability of raffle and poker runs licenses for such organizations; and,

WHEREAS, the County has thus endeavored to provide a system of raffle licensure that protects the public safety through ensuring that raffles are properly licensed and subject to appropriate legal standards and would now like to do that as it relates to poker runs; and,

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Clerk has recommended amendments to this section of the County Code to be reflective of State Law regarding poker runs;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDANED that the DeKalb County Board does hereby amend Chapter 7 of the County Code to replace the contents of said Chapter with the attached (Attachment A) amended and updated version of the Code.

DeKalb County Raffle and Poker Run Ordinance

I. TITLE

This chapter shall be known, cited and referred to as the “DeKalb County Raffle and Poker Run Ordinance”.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to regulate and control the conduct of raffles and poker runs within the unincorporated areas of the County and within the corporate limits of any municipality that is a party to any intergovernmental cooperation agreement for raffle and poker run licenses with the County.

III. DEFINITIONS

In the construction of this Ordinance, the definitions hereunder shall be observed and applied.

“Business” is a voluntary organization composed of individuals and/or businesses who have joined together to advance the commercial, financial, industrial and civic interests of a community.

“Charitable Organization” is an organization or institution organized and operated to benefit an indefinite number of the public. The service rendered to those eligible for benefits must also confer some benefit upon the public.

“Educational Organization” is an organization or institution organized and operated to provide systematic instruction in useful branches of learning by methods common to schools and institutions of learning which compare favorably in their scope and intensity with the course of study presented in tax-supported schools.

“Fraternal Organization” is an organization of persons having a common interest, the primary interest of which is to both promote the welfare of its members and to provide assistance to the general public in such a way as to lessen the burdens of government by caring for those who otherwise would be cared for by the government.

“Hardship” is a situation in which an organization that has not been in existence continuously for a period of five (5) years immediately before making application for a license organizes for the sole purpose of providing financial assistance to an identified individual or group of individuals suffering extreme financial hardship as the result of an illness, disability, accident or disaster.

“Labor Organization” is an organization composed of workers organized with the objective of betterment of the conditions of those engaged in such pursuit in the development of a higher degree of efficiency in their respective occupations.

“Licensee” is an organization which has been issued a license to operate a raffle or poker run.

“Net Proceeds” means the gross receipts from the conduct of raffles or poker runs, less sums expended for prizes, local license fees and other reasonable operating expenses incurred as a result of operating a raffle or poker run.

“Non-Profit” means organized, operated and conducted on a not-for-profit basis without personal profit to individual(s) or the organization.

“Person” means an individual, firm, organization, public or private corporation, government, partnership or unincorporated association.

“Poker Run” is an event in which participants travel to multiple predetermined locations, including a key location, to draw a playing card or equivalent item at each location in order to assemble a facsimile of a poker hand or other numeric score. “Poker run” includes dice runs, marble runs or other events where the objective is to build the best hand or highest score by obtaining an item at each location.

“Raffle” means a form of lottery, as defined in Section 28-2 (b) of the Criminal Code of 2012, conducted by an organization licensed under 230 ILCS 15/ (Raffles and Poker Runs Act), in which:

- (1) the player pays or agrees to pay something of value for a chance, represented and differentiated by a number or by a combination of numbers or by some other medium, one or more of which chances is to be designated as the winning chance; and
- (2) the winning chance is to be determined through a drawing or by some other method based on an element of chance by an act or set of acts on the part of persons conducting or connected with the lottery, except that the winning chance shall not be determined by the outcome of a publicly exhibited sporting contest.

“Religious Organization” is any church, congregation, society or organization founded for the purpose of religious worship.

“Veterans Organization” is any association comprised of members of which substantially all are individuals who are veterans or spouses, widows, or widowers of veterans, the primary purpose of which is to promote the welfare of its members and to provide assistance to the general public in such a way as to confer a public benefit.

IV. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

Any person seeking to conduct or operate a raffle or poker run as outlined in this Ordinance shall submit a Raffle / Poker Run Application using the form provided by the DeKalb County Clerk. Applications must be submitted to the County Clerk at least five (5) days prior to conducting a raffle or poker run, and prior to selling tickets or chances for a raffle. The fee for the license application is \$0 for all license classes. Completion of an application does not guarantee approval or issuance of a raffle / poker run license.

An organization may appeal license decisions in writing within ten (10) business days of decision by submitting notice of appeal to the county board office.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, business, corporation, organization or other entity to conduct or operate a poker run, conduct or operate a raffle or to sell, offer for sale, convey, issue or otherwise transfer for value, tickets or a chance on a raffle unless conducted pursuant to terms outlined on a raffle or poker run license duly issued by the County of DeKalb and in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance and the Raffles and Poker Runs Act (230 ILCS 15). A raffle or poker run license shall be valid for the period outlined on the license and shall not be valid for more than twelve (12) months.

Raffle and poker run licenses shall be issued only to bona fide business, religious, charitable, labor, fraternal, educational or veterans organizations that operate without profit to their members and which have been in existence continuously for a period of five (5) years or more immediately before applying for a license and which have had during that entire five (5) year period, a bona fide membership engaged in carrying out their objectives, or to an organization that the DeKalb County Clerk determines is organized for the sole purpose of providing financial assistance to an identified individual or group of individuals suffering extreme financial hardship as a result of an illness, disability, accident or disaster. The DeKalb County Clerk may waive the five (5) year requirement for bona fide business, religious, charitable, labor, fraternal, educational or veterans organizations that apply for a license to conduct a raffle or poker run if the organization has identified and maintains a valid non-profit certification from the Internal Revenue Service, or if the organization is a local organization that is affiliated with and chartered by a national or state organization that meets the five (5) year requirement. A current copy of the organization's constitution, by-laws or other documentation must be included with the Raffle / Poker Run Application at the time of submission. The following groups or individuals are ineligible for any license under this ordinance:

- A. Any person who has been convicted of a felony;
- B. Any person who is or has been a professional gambler or gambling promoter;
- C. Any person who is not of good moral character;
- D. Any firm or organization in which a person defined in A, B or C (above) has a proprietary, equitable or credit interest, or in which such a person is active or employed;
- E. Any organization in which a person defined in A, B or C (above) is an officer, director, or employee, whether compensated or not; and
- F. Any organization in which a person defined in A, B, or C (above) is to participate in the management or operation of a raffle or poker run as defined in this ordinance.

Political committees must include documentation of raffle approval from the State Board of Elections when applying for a raffle license with the DeKalb County Clerk. Raffle licenses for political committees will be issued in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Ordinance.

All operation and conduct of raffles and poker runs shall be under the supervision of a single manager designated by the licensee. A Fidelity bond must be obtained by an organization conducting a raffle or poker run and the bond must be submitted with each Raffle / Poker Run Application. A Personal Surety Bond may be obtained from the raffle / poker run manager in lieu of a Fidelity Bond for organizations conducting a raffle / poker run in which the total retail value of all prizes and merchandise awarded is less than \$5,000.00.

Organizations may request a bond waiver from the DeKalb County Clerk following a unanimous vote in support of the waiver by members of the organization conducting the raffle or poker run.

V. LICENSE ISSUANCE

The DeKalb County Clerk shall review all raffle and poker run applications and shall, within 30 days from the date of application, approve or deny the request for license. If the application is approved, the County Clerk shall issue the raffle or poker run license according to the following classification structure:

- A. *Class A – General Raffle License* – A general raffle license shall permit an organization the ability to conduct a raffle with a maximum single cash prize or the maximum retail value of a single non-cash prize not exceeding \$25,000.00, and an aggregate maximum value of all cash and non-cash prizes awarded not exceeding \$50,000.00. Multiple drawings may be held to award the prizes, but all drawings must occur on the same day and at the same location.
- B. *Class B – One Ticket, Multiple Raffles License* – This license allows up to four raffles to be conducted with the same raffle tickets. Each ticket shall specify the dates of ticket sales and the dates of each drawing. Each drawing date shall be considered a separate raffle and will require a separate license. Each license will allow one drawing event for the prizes awarded. Although a *Class B* license allows up to four raffles, the maximum value of cash and non-cash prize or prizes awarded to a single winner shall not exceed \$25,000.00, and the aggregate value of all prizes awarded in all of the raffles shall not exceed \$30,000.00.
- C. *Class C - One-Time Hardship Raffle License* – This license allows a not-for-profit fund-raising organization or group organized for the sole purpose of providing emergency financial assistance to an identified individual or group of individuals suffering severe financial hardship as a result of an injury, disability, accident or disaster to conduct one raffle for that purpose.
- D. *Class D – Twelve-Month Raffle License* – A twelve-month license shall permit the conduct of a raffle or raffles, or the sale of chances for a raffle or raffles, in which the maximum value of all cash or non-cash prizes for a single drawing shall not exceed \$5,000.00. *Class D* licenses shall be licensed annually for a twelve (12) consecutive month period commencing

on the day the license is approved. The aggregate value of all prizes awarded annually shall not exceed \$50,000.00.

- E. *Class E – Limited Annual Raffle License* – This license permits an organization to regularly conduct raffles among its own membership at regularly scheduled organizational meetings. Drawings may only be held, and chances for these raffles may only be sold on the day of the meeting. The aggregate value of the prizes awarded in each of these drawings may not exceed \$5,000.00. *Class E* raffles shall be licensed annually on a calendar year basis. The aggregate value of all prizes awarded annually shall not exceed \$50,000.00. Renewal applications shall be made on or before November 1st for the following calendar year.
- F. *Class F – Poker Run License* – A *Class F* license allows an organization to conduct a single poker run, dice run, marble run, or other event where the objective is to build the best hand or highest score by obtaining an item or playing a randomized game. A *Class F* license shall only be issued to provide financial assistance to an identified individual or group of individuals suffering extreme financial hardship as the result of an illness, disability, accident, or disaster or to maintain the financial stability of the organization.

VI. OPERATION AND CONDUCT

- A. The operation and conduct of a raffle or poker run shall be under the supervision of at least one raffle or poker run manager designated by the licensee.
- B. The entire net proceeds of any raffle or poker run must be exclusively devoted to the lawful purpose of the license.
- C. No person except a bona fide member of the licensee may participate in the management or operation of the raffle or poker run.
- D. No person may receive remuneration or profit for participating in the management or operation of the raffle or poker run.
- E. A licensee may rent the premises on which to determine the winning chance or chances in a raffle or poker run only from an organization which is also licensed under this ordinance.
- F. Raffle chances and poker run entrance fees may be sold, offered for sale, conveyed, issued or otherwise transferred for value only within the area(s) stated and for the time period(s) outlined on the license. The winning chances may be determined only at the location(s) specified on the license.
- G. If a raffle drawing or poker run is unable to be held as documented on the license due to an extreme emergency or natural disaster, the licensee must seek approval of the DeKalb County Clerk before the drawing or poker run can be held on a different date. If a drawing or poker run is cancelled due to inadequate sale of entries or raffle tickets or due to some reason other than an extreme emergency or natural disaster, the licensee must notify all participants or ticket purchasers, refund all monies and return all prizes within 30 days. Such cancellation will be reported to the DeKalb County Clerk within ten (10) days of that decision with a full explanation as to the reason.
- H. The maximum price which may be charged for each entry or raffle chance sold, offered for sale, conveyed, issued or otherwise transferred for value shall not exceed \$250.00.

- I. No cash prize in excess of \$25,000.00 may be awarded, and the value of all prizes to be awarded shall not exceed \$50,000.00.
- J. Each entry or raffle chance shall have printed thereon the cost of the entry or chance, the aggregate retail value of all prizes to be awarded in the raffle or poker run, and the maximum number of raffle chances or entries to be issued, except as provided below:
 - a. When raffle chances or entries are sold, conveyed, issued, or otherwise transferred only at the time and location at which winning chances will be determined and only to persons then in attendance.
 - b. When the raffle chance is also a ticket to an event and a portion of the cost of the ticket is designated for a dinner, golf or other item of value to be consumed or used by the purchaser at the event.
- K. A person under the age of 18 years may participate in the conducting of raffles or poker runs only with the written permission of a parent or guardian. A person under the age of 18 years may be within the area where winning chances in a raffle or winning hands or scores in a poker run are being determined only when accompanied by his or her parent or guardian.

VII. DOCUMENTATION & RECORDKEEPING

Each licensee shall report to the DeKalb County Clerk its gross receipts, expenses, and net proceeds from raffles and poker runs, including the payee, purpose, amount and date of payment. Reporting shall occur within thirty (30) days of each raffle drawing or poker run. No new raffle or poker run licenses will be issued to an organization until all reports from the organization's previous raffles or poker runs have been completed and submitted to the DeKalb County Clerk.

VIII. ENFORCEMENT

- A. Failure to comply with any of the requirements of the DeKalb County Raffle and Poker Run Ordinance shall constitute a violation. Any person, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$500.00. Each day the violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.
- B. The imposition of the penalties as described in this section shall not preclude the state's attorney from instituting appropriate action to prevent unlawful raffles or poker runs, or to restrain, correct or abate a violation of this Ordinance.

**A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR AND REQUIRING THE SUBMISSION
OF THE PROPOSITION FOR LEVYING A NEW TAX FOR COUNTY
HEALTH DEPARTMENT PURPOSES FOR DEKALB COUNTY, ILLINOIS,
TO THE VOTERS OF DEKALB COUNTY AT THE
GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016**

WHEREAS, DeKalb County, Illinois ("*County*") is subject to the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law of the State of Illinois, as amended ("*PTELL*"); and

WHEREAS, the County Board of the County ("*Board*") does hereby find and determine that the limiting rate for the County is not sufficient to provide funds to pay the cost of providing for the operating needs of the County Health Department; and

WHEREAS, the County has heretofore levied taxes for the purpose of retiring all or part of the principal and interest due and owing on the Series 2005, DeKalb County Public Building Commission Revenue Refunding Bonds (the "*Bond Levy*"); and

WHEREAS, the Bond Levy shall expire after the 2015 tax year due to the retirement of the aforementioned bonds; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to replace the Bond Levy with a new levy of equal value to provide for the operating needs of the County Health Department without increasing the aggregate amount of property taxes; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined by the Board that the need exists for levying a new tax for County Health Department purposes at a rate equal to 0.10%; and

WHEREAS, the most recent levy year for which the limiting rate of the County is known is 2015; and

WHEREAS, before the County is authorized to levy a new tax for County Health Department purposes, a proposition therefor ("*Proposition*") must be submitted to the voters of

the County as provided by PTELL, and be approved by a majority of the voters of the County voting on the Proposition at an election to be held in and for the County; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the County that the Proposition be submitted to the voters of the County at an election to be held and conducted in accordance with the General Election Law; and

WHEREAS, PTELL requires that the ballot for the Proposition shall have printed thereon, but not as a part of the Proposition, certain supplemental information as set forth and described in PTELL; and

WHEREAS, such supplemental information shall be supplied by the County to the election authority; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed and approved the supplemental information appearing on the form of ballot for the Proposition hereinafter set forth in this Resolution and finds any error, miscalculation, or inaccuracy in computing any amount set forth on the ballot and in the notice is not deliberate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of DeKalb County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Need to Submit to Voters. It is necessary and in the best interests of the County that a new tax for County Health Department purposes be levied at a rate equal to 0.10% of the equalized assessed value of the taxable property therein extended for such purposes.

Section 3. Submission to Voters. The Proposition shall be submitted to the voters of the County in accordance with the General Election Law at the General Election to be held on

Tuesday, the 8th Day of November, 2016, between the hours of 6:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 o'clock P.M. on said day ("*Election*"), and at all times that early voting is conducted in accordance with the Election Code of the State of Illinois, as amended ("*Election Code*"), and the Proposition as approved shall be presented in the form set forth below in Section 9 of this Resolution.

Section 4. Voting Precincts and Polling Places. The Election shall be held in the voting precincts and at the polling places established by the County Board for voters of the County at the Election.

Section 5. Election Notice. The County Clerk of DeKalb County ("*County Clerk*") shall give notice of the Election ("*Notice*") in accordance with Section 12-5 of the General Election Law by (i) publishing the Notice at least once not more than 30 nor less than 10 days prior to the date of the Election in a local, community newspaper having general circulation in the County, and (ii) posting a copy of the Notice at least 10 days before the date of the Election at the principal office of the County Clerk.

Section 6. Local Notice. The County Clerk shall post a copy of the Notice at the principal office of the County immediately after adoption of this Resolution.

Section 7. Newspaper of General Circulation. It is hereby found and determined that the _____ is a local, community newspaper having general circulation in the County as required by Section 12-5 of the Election Code.

Section 8. Form of Notice. The Notice shall appear over the name or title of the County Clerk and shall be substantially in the following form:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the General Election to be held on Tuesday, the 8th Day of November, 2016, the following proposition will be submitted to the voters of DeKalb County, Illinois:

Shall the County of DeKalb, Illinois, be authorized to levy a new tax for county health department purposes and have an additional tax of 0.1% of the equalized assessed value of the taxable property therein extended for such purposes?

(1) The approximate amount of taxes extendable at the most recently extended limiting rate is \$21,530,492.77, and the approximate amount of taxes extendable if the proposition is approved is \$23,271,878.47.

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Drug Court has sought to open a Sober Living Home to better serve clients on their path to dealing with their addiction, and

WHEREAS, DeKalb County Government did purchase a home at 491 E State Street in Sycamore, IL on June 2, 2015 for \$145,000 to be used as a Sober Living Home, and

WHEREAS, the Sober Living Home required various work to meet Life-Safety Codes, to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and to meet the applicable codes of the City of Sycamore, and

WHEREAS, during the time-period when this work was being planned and performed, interior damage occurred during this last winter from a broken water pipe and that damage added to the scope of work needed to be performed, and

WHEREAS, the estimates to complete all construction work on the Sober Living Home is now around \$175,000, subject to change as demolition areas could result in unforeseen problems as well as added costs with additional code reviews, and that amount exceeds the \$125,000 that is available with Drug Court funds, and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator has recommended that additional monies could be made available from the Opportunity Fund, which was the original source of funds for the purchase of the house, and that some of this money could be “recovered” by additionally “investing” Opportunity Funds in the internal loan program for the Jail Expansion Project, and

WHEREAS, the Law & Justice Committee has reviewed the facts surrounding the need for more monies, the source of where those monies could be generated, and has concluded and recommends that this project is still very worthwhile, to the citizens of DeKalb County in general and the clients of the Drug Court in particular, to make continuing this project a priority;

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
Regarding the Cost & Operations of Dispatching Services in DeKalb County

This Memorandum of Agreement (“Agreement”) is effective as of July 1, 2016 by and between the _____ Fire Protection District, the County of DeKalb (“County”), and the DeKalb County Sheriff.

SECTION A – Responsibilities of the Parties.

1. General Considerations
 - a. The County’s obligation under this agreement shall be to receive telephonic or other messages intended by the sender to be received by the Fire Protection District and to communicate by means of and in the manner consistent with standard operating procedures of the DeKalb County Sheriff’s Communication Center such messages to the appropriate agency. The District’s Fire Department will be responsible to acknowledge and respond to those messages transmitted by the Communications Center. The County shall perform its obligations under the agreement in a professional manner, consistent with typical established dispatching protocols. Such services shall be maintained on a seven-day per week, 24-hour per day basis, and the County shall take all necessary measures to maintain dispatching equipment and services in a state of readiness.
 - b. The employees in the consolidated dispatch center shall be hired by the County Sheriff in accordance with the rules of the County Merit Commission.
 - c. One representative from the Fire Protection District may join in a “User’s Committee” chaired by the DeKalb County Sheriff or his designee and said User Committee will serve in an advisory role to the Sheriff. This committee will meet on a quarterly basis allowing for special meetings as necessary. Issues requiring immediate attention are addressed in the “DeKalb County Fire Dispatch Operational Manual”.

SECTION B -- Other Considerations

1. Term. This Agreement shall be for an initial term of five (5) years, effective as of July 1, 2016. This Agreement shall automatically renew for additional similar length terms after the initial term. Either party may terminate their participation in the Agreement after notifying the other in writing of their intent to do so at least one (1) year in advance.
2. Contract Costs. The annual cost of this contract to the Fire District is contained in Exhibit A of this Agreement. Future amounts will be negotiated in good faith by all parties prior to the renewal period.

3. **Litigation.** The Fire District, the County, and the Sheriff acknowledge s that this Agreement is duly authorized and is a binding obligation, enforceable in accordance with its terms and provisions. In the event any person or entity, other than the parties hereto, attempts to enjoin or otherwise challenge the validity of any recital or provision of this Agreement, the Fire District, the County, and the Sheriff agree that they will not take a position adverse to enforcement of this Agreement. It is further agreed that if the County is unable to provide radio dispatch services at any time during the term of this Agreement due to public emergency or necessity, labor disputes, strikes, boycotts, secondary boycotts, acts of God, or for any other reason including but not restricted to mechanical breakdowns beyond the control and without the fault of the Fire District, the Fire District shall not be liable to the County for any damages that may result.
4. **Amendment.** This Agreement shall not be amended except by a written instrument signed by the parties hereto.
5. **Notices.** All notices and other communications between the parties shall be in writing and shall be sent by (a) a standard overnight carrier; (b) certified U.S. mail return receipt requested; or (c) delivered personally to the parties at the official legal address for each entity.
6. **Mutual Assistance and Consents.** The parties agree to use their reasonable efforts to do all things necessary or appropriate to execute this Agreement and to aid and assist each other in carrying out the terms of this Agreement including, without limitation, the enactment by the Entities of such ordinances and/or resolutions and the taking of other actions as may be necessary to enable the parities to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. In the event any party to this Agreement is required to grant its consent or approval to the other party in connection with any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement, such consent or approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
7. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or entity is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, and the application of such provision to any other person or entity, shall not be affected thereby, and to such end the provisions of this Agreement are agreed to be severable.
8. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the full and entire understanding and agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements, negotiations, drafts, and exhibits thereto and understandings, both written and oral, between the parties.
9. **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and insure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns.

10. The Fire District agrees to hold the County & Sheriff harmless against persons not parties to this Agreement and reimburses the County for any and all such damages, suits, claims, judgments or monies, including, but not limited to, attorney fees and costs of litigation, arising out of the performance or non-performance of the District personnel working under this Agreement.
11. The County & Sheriff agree to hold the Fire District harmless against persons not parties to this Agreement and reimburse the Fire District for any and all such damages, suits, claims, judgments or monies, including, but not limited to, attorney fees and costs of litigation, arising out of the performance or non-performance of the County personnel working under this Agreement against such persons not parties to this Agreement.
12. Waiver. Any agreement between the parties to waive any rights or obligations arising under this Agreement shall be valid only if set forth in writing or signed by both parties. Such waiver shall be effective only for the purpose set forth in such writing and shall not affect the rights of the parties regarding any subsequent acts or missions by the other party which may result in a breach under this Agreement.
13. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which shall constitute but one (1) instrument.

SUPPLEMENTAL MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT



Re: Appointment of Election Judges and Leading Political Party

According to the Illinois State Statutes (10ILCS 5/13) the County Board shall select and approve the proper ratio of persons to serve as Election Judges in each Precinct from the certified lists which have been filed with the County Clerk.

"Leading Political Party" means one of the two Political Parties whose Candidates for Governor at the most recent three Gubernatorial Elections received either the highest or second highest average number of votes. The Political Party whose Candidates for Governor received the highest average number of votes shall be known as the first leading Political Party and the Political Party whose Candidates for Governor received the second highest average number of votes shall be known as the second leading Political Party.

The ratio had not been re-configured since the 2014 cycle and upon examination it was determined that the ratios needed to be re-evaluated and corrected. Attached is a spreadsheet containing the new configuration and will be valid for the next two years, the current Election Judge cycle.

**AFSCME COUNCIL 31, LOCAL NO. 3537
CONTRACT HIGHLIGHTS
January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020**

The new contract is identical to the previous contract, with the following exceptions:

1. Regarding Nursing in the Workplace (new language): The Employer shall provide reasonable unpaid break time each day to an employee who needs to express breast milk for her infant child. The Employer shall make reasonable efforts to provide a room or other location, in close proximity to the work area, other than a toilet stall, where an employee can express her milk in privacy.
2. Regarding Call Back (new language is underlined): Once eight (8) hours have been worked, PHO's may still be used for time off during the period that represents normal working hours for that day; but only if such time off was scheduled prior to being called in. It is expressly agreed that a callback assignment is for a specific purpose and the Employer shall not assign employees who complete their callback assignment work that is outside of their normal work duties in order to fill the remaining hours unless there is a business need to do so.
3. Regarding On Call (new language): Employees may be called back to work only if management determines that there is a reasonable business need. This right will not be exercised in an arbitrary or capricious manner or else it may be the basis of a grievance.
4. Regarding Clothing Allowance (new language is underlined): Facilities Management Maintenance Personnel, and the Engineering Technicians and Permit and Inventory Control Technician at the Highway Department shall receive an annual uniform allowance in lieu of actual uniforms in the amount of \$430.00 per year effective January 1, 2016, \$435 per year effective January 1, 2017, and \$440 per year effective January 1, 2018.

In addition to normal work attire, the uniform allowance may also be used for the following additional items: winter coat, rain coat, gloves, and safety colored T-shirts (when required).

5. Regarding Insurance (new language is added): During the term of this Agreement, the County will continue to pay seventy-five percent (75%) for the premium cost of employee coverage with the covered employees continuing to pay the remaining percent (25%) of the premium costs.

Provided, however, effective 01/01/2016, and thereafter for the remaining term of the Agreement, increases to the employee's premium costs shall be capped as follows:

20% for 2016
21% for 2017
22% for 2018
23% for 2019
24% for 2020

6. Regarding Wages: The Parties agree to the following increases:
1. Effective 01/01/2016: 1% increase in base wage rates;
 2. Effective 01/01/2017: 2% increase in base wage rates;
 3. Effective 01/01/2018: 2% increase in base wage rates;
 4. Effective 01/01/2019: 2% increase in base wage rates;
 5. Effective 01/01/2020: 2% increase in base wage rates.
