The Regional Office of Education (ROE) spends considerable time assisting the Illinois State Board of Education in processing the great number of applications, reports, claims for reimbursement, etc., which are required in today's education world.

Our office policy mandates prompt and courteous attention to all requests coming to our office for information and assistance with educational issues. This is a year-round, daily service and constitutes one of the greatest demands on our collective time and energy.

Cooperation Management

- Assist the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) in the evaluation and recognition of public schools and private schools who ask to be recognized
- Maintain maps of all school districts

- Monitor public schools during strikes
- Remove any member of a school board for failure to perform official duties
- Assist with cooperatives, special education programs, and vocational programs

Services to Educators Regarding Licensure

The Regional Office of Education assists teachers seeking an Illinois Professional Educator License including applications, registrations, endorsements, and renewals. The ROE is the resource for local educators who have licensure questions or who need training on the Educator Licensure Information System (ELIS). According to the ELIS statistics report, 869 educators registered a total of 891 licenses, 501 new teacher licenses were issued, 62 new endorsements were issued, and 107 new paraprofessional licenses were issued.

The Regional Office of Education operates a digital fingerprinting system that allows a quick return of criminal background information to the local school districts at a cost of \$55.00 per employee, substitute, or student teacher. The ROE also provides this service to local bus drivers, healthcare workers, school and community agency volunteers. The office conducted a total of 1315 fingerprints and criminal history records checks in FY17.

Credentials services are also related to compliance assistance services. Annually, the DeKalb ROE checks the credentials of employed teachers, administrators, and paraprofessionals (assistants). ROE staff not only enforces credential requirements, but also assists districts and individual educators when there are licensure questions.

Certification of Bus Drivers / Transportation

The Regional Office offers the initial 8-hour training required for all new school bus drivers prior to getting a bus permit. This training includes driver safety and first aid. The ROE also offers the annual 2-hour refresher workshop required in the 12-month period prior to renewal. This is prescribed by the Illinois State Board of Education and administered by the ROE.

Five initial courses were held at the ROE, and were taught by Carolyn Amerman, Tom Boyce, Charlene Bridges, Jason Calloway, and John Leech. Sixty drivers were trained at these sessions. There were also fourteen refresher courses provided mostly on location at school districts. A total of 412 drivers attended these trainings. The Assistant Superintendent facilitated four Transportation Directors' meetings and one Instructors' Meeting.

Recognition of Schools

The DeKalb County ROE issued, in conjunction with the Illinois State Board of Education, the status of Recognition to each of the eight public school districts in DeKalb County.

The Regional Office conducted a full state recognition compliance visit to two school districts: DeKalb CUSD 428, and Hinckley-Big Rock CUSD 429 during the 2016-17 school year.


Compliance items cover a broad range, including: personnel files and properly credentialed employees, student records, school improvement plans, special education services, board policy, website requirements, treatment of homeless students, staff evaluation methods and procedure, and mandatory staff trainings.

Services for Substitute Teachers

The ROE maintains a database of all substitute teachers in DeKalb County. It also maintains the records for substitutes such as their blood-borne pathogens training, physical exams and TB results, mandated reporter acknowledgement, criminal history records information, and proper licensure.

Substitute teachers enrolled with the DeKalb ROE can guest teach in all of the school districts and private schools in DeKalb County. During the 2016-2017 school year, 414 substitute teachers took advantage of this service. The ROE continued its efforts to recruit and retain substitute teachers. Recruiting activities were held on February 27, 2017. On August 2, 2016, the ROE also provided a one-day workshop to prepare substitute teachers covering topics such as student safety, classroom management, instructional strategies, and social emotional learning.

Regional Board of School Trustees

The Regional Superintendent acts as ex-officio secretary for the Regional Board of School Trustees. The Board hears district consolidation cases and cases in which individuals wish to detach from one district and annex to another district. There was one such petition filed on April 26, 2016, and the Board held the hearing on October 3, 2016. Twelve petitioners requested detachment of their properties from DeKalb 428 and annexation to Sycamore 427. The request was denied by the Regional Board. The decision was appealed in court on May 12, 2017, where the Regional Board decision was upheld.

Members of the Board are elected for six-year staggered terms by countywide elections.

Professional Development for Educators

Registration fees of teachers' licenses are classified as institute funds that are allocated by the ROE for teachers' institutes, workshops, and either professional development or licensure-related activities. Another \$2,450 was provided to five districts for their attendance at the Raising Student Achievement Conference held on December 5-6, 2016. The DeKalb ROE also coordinated and facilitated eight Superintendents' workshops and two Principals' workshops.

Additionally, the ROE re-applied for and secured a grant from ISBE for a New Teacher Induction program for Hiawatha CUSD 426, Sandwich CUSD 430, and Kishwaukee Education Consortium. These funds provided for training for new mentors, new teacher professional development sessions and ongoing mentor support forums.

One of the most successful events of the year was nationally recognized Grace Dearborn in June 2017. She presented on *Conscious Classroom Management* strategies. Feedback was so positive that the ROE has contracted with one of her associates to present *The Brain Compatible Classroom* in June 2018.

Kishwaukee Intermediate Delivery System

The Kishwaukee Intermediate Delivery System (KIDS) is the professional development consortium of the Regional Offices of Education for DeKalb, McHenry, and Boone/Winnebago Counties. Until June 30, 2017, the DeKalb ROE contributed its state ROE Services grant funds to the KIDS consortium. Effective July 1, 2017, the DeKalb ROE withdrew from the consortium in order to build its own professional development team and be more flexible and responsive to the needs of DeKalb County educators. In addition to ROE Services, ISBE continued to financially support the initiative of Foundational Services in the areas of language arts, math, balanced assessment, teacher evaluation, family engagement, and continuous improvement planning.

Foundational Services are offered to DeKalb County educators at low or no-cost. Going forward, the topics covered under "Foundational Services 2.0" have been expanded to include social studies, poverty, restorative justice, physical education, trauma, instructional strategies, social emotional learning, English language learning, classroom management, and integrating technology.



Testing Center

Thanks to DeKalb County making available a computer lab, the DeKalb ROE continues to be a PearsonVUE authorized testing center on Tuesdays 9am—4pm. Registrations are done online through PearsonVUE. In FY17, 443 different candidates tested on a total of 593 tests. There were 52 regularly scheduled testing days, averaging 11 candidates per day. Five additional days were scheduled to meet the demand of Paraprofessional Testing and additional days were specially scheduled to serve testers who required accommodations such as extended time or adaptive equipment. In order to register for the ETS Paraprofessional Assessment, individuals need to go to dekalbroe.org and register and pay online. We are working on trend data now that the testing center has been open for four years. FY17 was our biggest year for number of tests administered. The tests with the most growth in administration were the paraprofessional and the GED.



Illinois High School Equivalency Testing and Issuance


The General Educational Development (GED) is a battery of high school equivalency tests. Individuals may register at www.ged.com and choose DeKalb County ROE as the testing site. Upon completing requirements, the individual may request a copy of their transcript for \$8 and/or certificate for \$10. During 2016-17, 52 IHSE certificates and 89 IHSE transcripts were requested and issued, allowing individuals to move forward with their educational or career plans. The Constitution Test for Illinois High School Equivalency continues to be available at no cost to the candidate and appointments are made by calling the ROE.

Services for Homeless Students and Their Families

The McKinney-Vento Act, signed into law in Illinois on January 24, 1995 ensures that students who are considered homeless maintain consistent school attendance with minimal disruption. During the 2016-2017 school year, 313 homeless youth were identified in DeKalb County. Denise Curran served as the DeKalb County Liaison for Homeless Students, training school district personnel in identifying homeless children and those in housing crises and providing the supports necessary to ensure consistent school attendance with minimal disruption. Services allowed by the grant include transportation assistance, clothes, hygiene products, food, tutoring, and doctors' visits. The DeKalb ROE appreciates Hope Haven and Safe Passage for their support of homeless students and their families.



Truancy Supervision


This was the thirtieth year that DeKalb County was part of a Truants' Alternative Optional Education Program. DeKalb County Truancy Intervention Program (DCTIP) was funded through a grant from the Illinois State Board of Education and was administered and facilitated through the Regional Office of Education, with the Assistant Superintendent serving as DCTIP Director. Truancy outreach staff worked with truant students and their families to improve attendance by providing intervention services, acting as a liaison between home and school, referring children and families to DeKalb County service agencies, and coordinating a credit-recovery program. While early interventions are preferred, the DeKalb ROE appreciates working with the State Attorney's Office and DeKalb County Court Services when needed. Trend data is provided here to help express the need for additional resources.

Total student enrollment in public schools was 16,976; 3.2% of all DeKalb County public school students were referred to DCTIP. In FY17, 2.6% of all students were referred to DCTIP. Out of the 542 referred, 36% were Black or African American, 20% were Hispanic or Latino, and 39% were White. Males constituted 58% and females were 42%. The grade from which the greatest number of referrals came was 1st (qualifying as Educational Neglect), followed by 10th, 11th, and then 9th.



Kishwaukee Education Consortium

KEC serves DeKalb, Genoa-Kingston, Hiawatha, Sycamore, Hinckley-Big Rock, Indian Creek, Sandwich, Somonauk and Rochelle. KEC is the Regional Safe School Program, providing alternative education to students who have multiple suspensions or an expulsion. This program is part of the ReStart program which gives students the opportunity to “restart” their academic, social, and emotional growth. At the end of 2016-17, 35 students were enrolled in the Safe School. Additionally, we were awarded a new grant for Safe School students to engage in career technical education, learn career skills, and obtain work placements under a KEC supervisor.

Visits for Homeschooled Children

The ROE visits home school families and can request evidence of curriculum, completed work, and assessment as well as verification of start dates, overall satisfaction with the program and progress of the home school student. During FY17, the ROE visited two home school families. The ROE also assists families in registering as a home school .

Northwestern Illinois Association

The Northwestern Illinois Association (NIA) is an association of public school districts in the ten northwestern counties of Illinois, which provides services to children with low incidence disabilities such as severe sight or hearing problems or orthopedic impairments. A large geographic area is needed in order to provide an effective and economical program since a very small percentage of children are found in these categories.
